Personal Information Form: Please fill in all questions. This fellowship is open to US citizens and permanent residents.

Statement of Research: What are your research interests with respect to HIV, substance abuse, and criminal justice? What is a pressing current problem in those areas that needs attention in the field(s) of social work and/or public health? What qualifies you as a unique and/or outstanding candidate for this fellowship? The statement should be no more than 1 page, using 11- or 12-point font.

Curriculum Vitae: The curriculum vitae should include the following sections:

- Name and Mailing address.
- Education with degree and dates of completion.
- Paid employment.
- Honors and awards (including grant awards).
- Professional affiliations and licensures.
- Research and evaluation experience, teaching experience, publications, presentations at conferences, and continuing education.

Writing Sample: This is an optional item. The submission should be a scholarly, journal length manuscript that the applicant was the major contributor (first author).
